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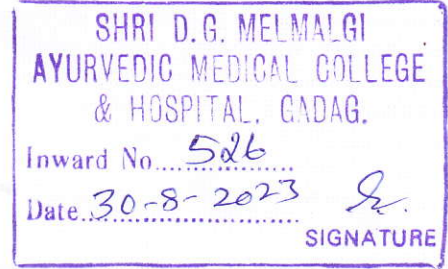

Subject:-Grant of conditional permission to JSVV Samsthe's Danappa Gurushiddappa Melmalagi Ayurvedic Medical College, Hospital, Dr. Savadi Road, Shivananda Nagar, Ta. & Distt. Gadag-582103, Karnataka (Inst ID: AYU0080) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses [instead of 19 seats] in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats (iii) Rasa Shashtra and Bhaishajya Kalpana- 05 seats (iv) Panchkarma- 03 seats (instead of 05 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **JSVV Samsthe's Danappa Gurushiddappa Melmalagi Ayurvedic Medical College, Hospital, Dr. Savadi Road, Shivananda Nagar, Ta. & Distt. Gadag-582103, Karnataka (Inst ID: AYU0080)** inspection of your College was conducted on **15.05.2023 & 16.05.2023 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the **Conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 19 seats in 04 PG courses** in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats (iii) Rasa Shashtra and Bhaishajya Kalpana- 05 seats (iv) Panchkarma- 05 seats for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

1) Shortcoming for PG is as under:-

2) Functionality of the hospital

- Animal House not available in college.
- Demonstration room is not available.

3) Visitors observation report:-

- Audio visual facility was not available in class rooms and ICT was also not enabled.

In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **50th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **03.08.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 25.08.2023** to appear on **25.08.2023** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 19 seats in 04 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats (iii) Rasa Shashtra and Bhaishajya Kalpana- 05 seats (iv) Panchkarma- 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.**

4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide ref. no. DGM/AMC/2023-24 dated 25/08/2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. S.N. Belavadi and Dr. Kumar S. Thodalappar and Associate professor in Dravyaguna department** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **25.08.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under: -

5. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM),** the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **55th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 25.08.2023.**

6. In view of the above shortcoming and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college was fulfilling the **basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and in 03 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats (iii) Rasa Shashtra and Bhaishajya Kalpana- 05 seats and not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of permission in one PG course in the subject namely- (i) Panchkarma- 05 seats due to non-availability of teaching faculty as per PG Regulations, 2016.**

7. **However, Board decided to issue permission in the Panchkarma PG Department as per the available teacher student ratio as mentioned in the sub regulation 1 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 which is as under –**

As per sub regulation 1 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, The teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor and as per sub regulation 2 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 The teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience.

In the department of Panchkarma, college is having 03 eligible teaching faculty (01 Professor for UG and 01 Assistant Professor for UG and 01 Assistant Professor for PG) and there is shortcoming of 01 Higher faculty in the Panchkarma PG department and no Assistant professor are having more than 05 years of teaching experience and accordingly, as per the available faculty college is not fulfilling the teacher student ratio as per the submitted seats in Part-1 and eligible for issuance of permission with 03 seats (instead of 05 seats) in the department of Panchkarma.

Accordingly, as per PG Regulation 2016, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Conditional Permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses [instead of 19 seats] in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats (iii) Rasa Shashtra and Bhaishajya Kalpana- 05 seats (iv) Panchkarma- 03 seats (instead of

05 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder for the academic session 2023-24.

8. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Grant of Conditional Permission is issued to JSVV Samsthe's Danappa Gurushiddappa Melmalagi Ayurvedic Medical College, Hospital, Dr. Savadi Road, Shivananda Nagar, Ta. & Distt. Gadag-582103, Karnataka (Inst ID: AYU0080) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses [instead of 19 seats] in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats (iii) Rasa Shashtra and Bhaishajya Kalpana- 05 seats (iv) Panchkarma- 03 seats (instead of 05 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder for the academic session 2023-24.**
- (i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- (ii) It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 17 seats in 04 PG courses [instead of 19 seats]** seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
9. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
12. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance **report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:**
- (i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016
- (iii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- (iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
